HOW DOES A MONTESSORI EDUCATION DIFFER FROM A TRADITIONAL **LEARNING INSTITUTION?** At the heart of Montessori education is the individuality of each child. Using the guiding principles of Dr. Maria Montessori, our goal is to cultivate within each student a sense of curiosity and a well-developed sense of maturity. At the very beginning of a Center Montessori student's schooling, the child is introduced to teaching tools that engage the child and invite learning. These didactic materials serve a host of uses as the student is enabled to understand new concepts and by engaging with the materials the child is able to make generalizations beyond the scope of the materials. Upon entering a Center Montessori classroom, one is immediately struck by the openness of the room and the physical freedom it affords the child. Called a Children's House for the younger child, the four walls of our classrooms are home to children with a three-year age span. Each child plays a role in the continuum of learning by acting as a leader to the younger students through example and collaboration, understanding when to take on responsibility by serving as a mentor. This approach is a key factor in teaching collaboration and instilling a desire for lifelong learning. Through Center Montessori's state approved curriculum, there is no set ceiling to the breadth of each topic being taught. The student is not limited by the finite beginning and end of lessons within a set curriculum, but each student is encouraged to explore and continue the journey to mastery over a subject. The faculty and staff at Center Montessori make it their mission to inspire learning and promote an environment that is creative, fosters inquisitive minds, but is still nurturing and encouraging. With the newest teacher's tenure of 6 years with the school, there is a perceived passion and desire among the entire staff to watch each child learn and flourish in a community environment.

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Center Montessori is committed to the Montessori Method of education and every classroom from toddlers to middle school is specially equipped with didactic Montessori materials. These manipulative materials make it possible for children to learn by doing rather than by being told. The materials are age appropriate and are intended to be presented to children in order to enhance their learning and awareness, first to simple concepts, and later to complicated academic ideas. In addition to these very beautiful materials, each classroom is under the direction of a certified Montessori teacher who knows the function of the materials, understands how children learn, is adept at observing and interpreting children, and is prepared to meet the educational needs of each child on an individual basis. In addition to the Montessori Method, the school is known for its success in teaching children to read and write through the phonetic approach called "Words in Color". Heavily influenced by Dr. Caleb Gattegno's work in reading and mathematics education, the school strives to subordinate teaching to learning through an individualized approach to reading and mathematics. Specially-prepared, colored reading charts enhance the children's awareness about how the letters work to form words as well as which letters are needed to write certain spelling words. Consequently, children become fluent readers and competent spellers as well as prolific writers. For mathematics, in addition to the familiar Montessori math materials, our school utilizes colored math rods, which give the children the chance to see the algebraic relationships between numbers. Children become gymnasts with numbers. Completing the Montessori curriculum are studies in music, drama, band, jazz band, chorus, Spanish immersion, foreign languages, art, art history, yoga, computer education and physical education.

HOW CAN WE GET HELP FOR YOUNG CHILDREN WITH BEHAVIORAL OR PSYCHOLOGICAL CONDITIONS? Navigating school years can be difficult for children struggling with behavioral or psychological conditions. And often, the issues facing children and teenagers are most noticeable in academic performance, social interactions with peers and authority figures. Dr. Christina de Guia is a board certified psychiatrist specialized in the evaluation and management of children and adolescents with common forms of psychiatric conditions including Depression, Social Anxiety, Posttraumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, Eating disorders, Attention Deficit Disorder (ADHD), Oppositional Defiant Disorder, Early Onset Psychosis, Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders. While each diagnosis is different, children experiencing any of these conditions may have difficulty concentrating or participating in a classroom setting thus affecting their grades and academic performance.

Working with young patients through therapy and various treatments can lessen the symptoms of their condition and ensure a path to improved concentration, healthy communication and clearer goals. As behavioral issues are easily affected by mood or environmental changes, Dr. de Guia meets with her patients and their families to understand the issues they are facing and develop a custom plan for growth and healing. Dr. de Guia provides problem-focused supportive psychotherapy with adolescents and adults, and can provide necessary medication for an optimal treatment plan. Developing boundaries and working with patients to establish techniques to better deal with anxiety and stress can have a profound affect on behavior, performance and easing into changes that are very marked throughout the school year. Dr. de Guia handles each patient with an expert level of care and seeks to provide a custom treatment plan that is age appropriate and balances the needs and wellbeing of the child and family. Seeing each patient holistically plays a large role in assisting them to reach their full potential in school, at home and in years to come.

While early care and therapies are critical to all young children, once they move on from early care, they never are forced to cycle out of Easter Seals programming due to age. After graduating from The Lily School, the organization continues to provide a path of support for all ages. Through onsite after school and summer programs, The Vocational Introduction and Preparation (VIP) Academy high school and employment partnerships, Easter Seals is able to guide their lifelong students to a life well lived.
