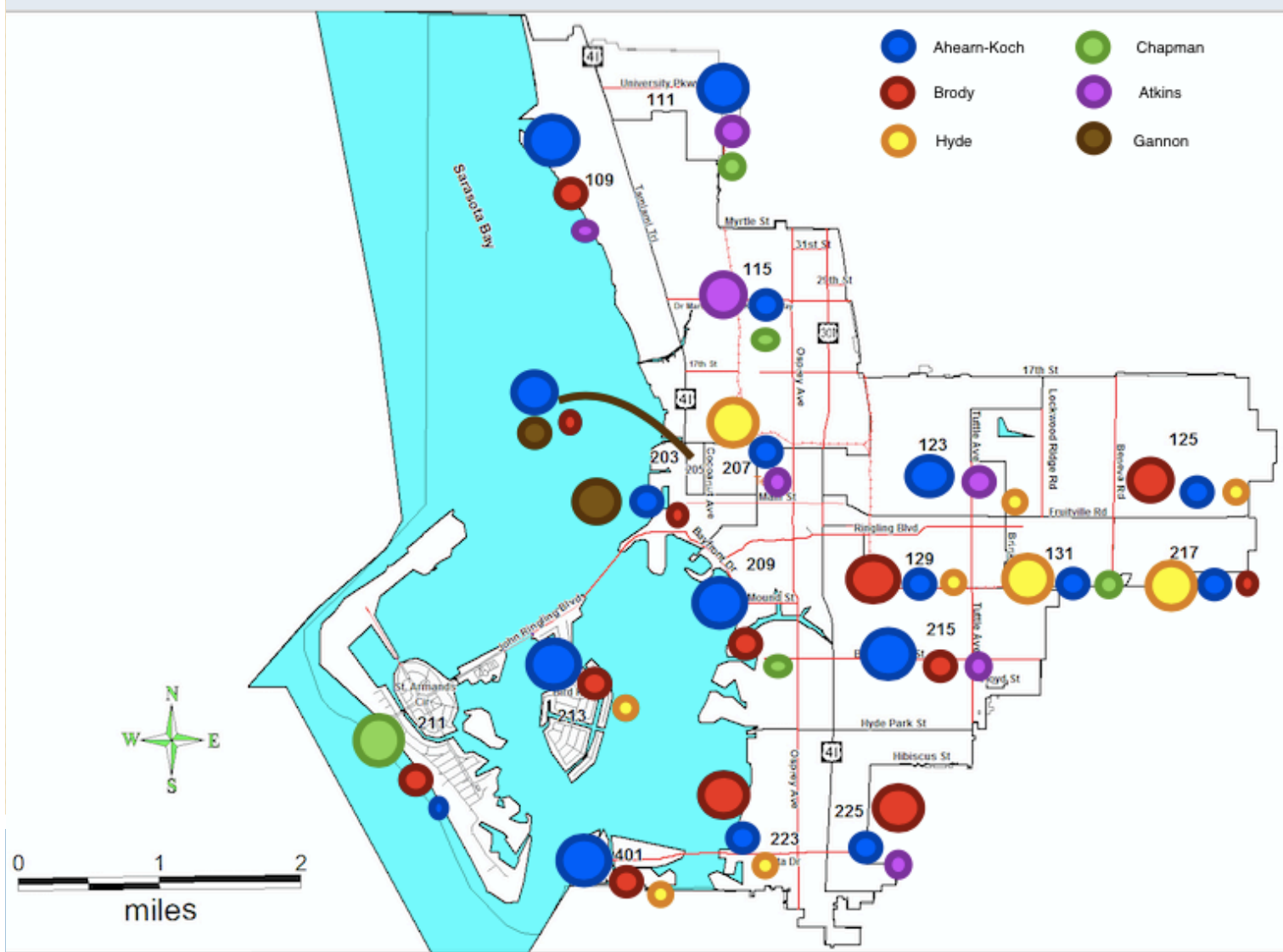

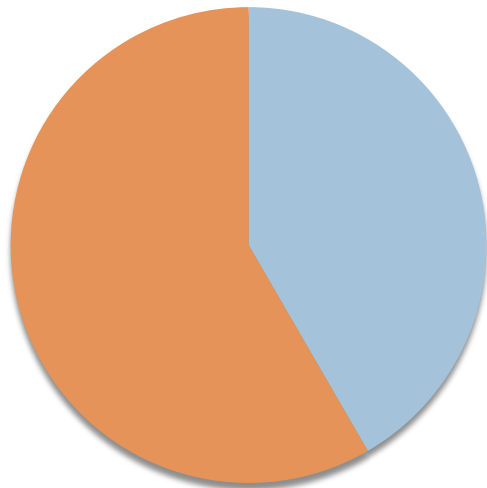
Precinct winners



Ahearn-Koch placed first or second in nearly every precinct, while Brody performed well outside North Sarasota. Atkins and Gannon drew exceptional support in North Sarasota and Downtown respectively. Hyde and Chapman, meanwhile, lacked a firm geographic constituency. They were still able to beat purely geographic candidates but fought for third place.

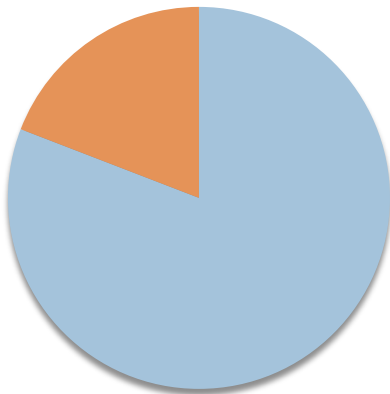
Voter Turnout

Longboat Key

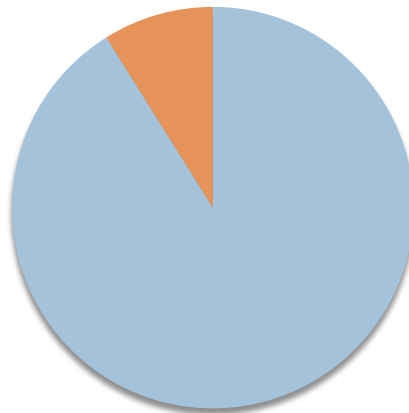


■ Registered

North Port



Turnout was low in Sarasota (just over 19%), and exceptionally so in North Port (8.9%, where there was a special election. But turnout on Longboat Key rivaled general election figures in other communities, most likely thanks to the Colony vote. Not only did the island see nearly 60 percent turnout, but every voter made a selection in the two Commission races and in the Colony referendum.

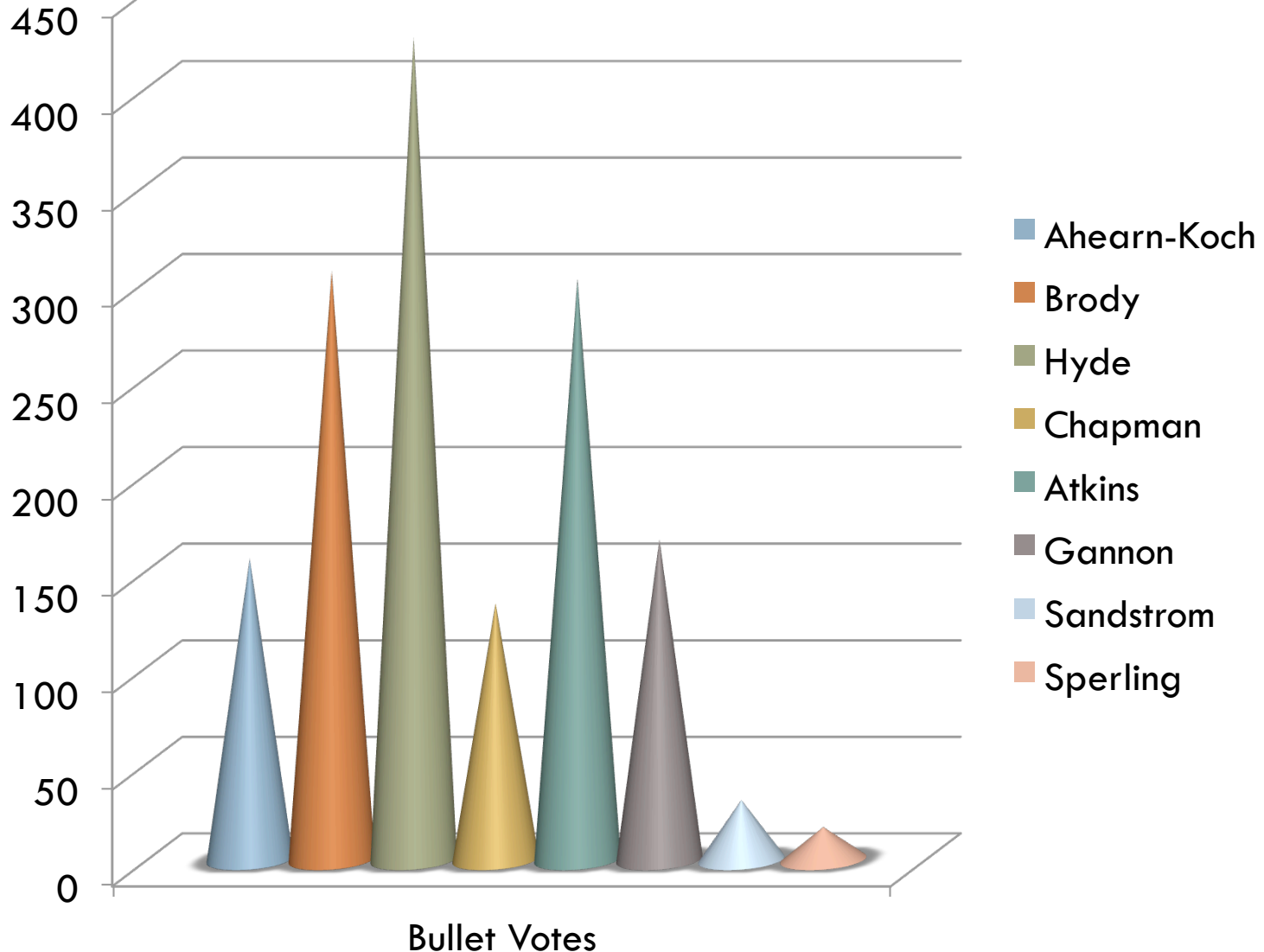
North Port

Luke won absentee, early voting and polling. Emrich did well in a couple areas around Toledo Blade and Salford, while Nicastro performed in the city's western-most district.

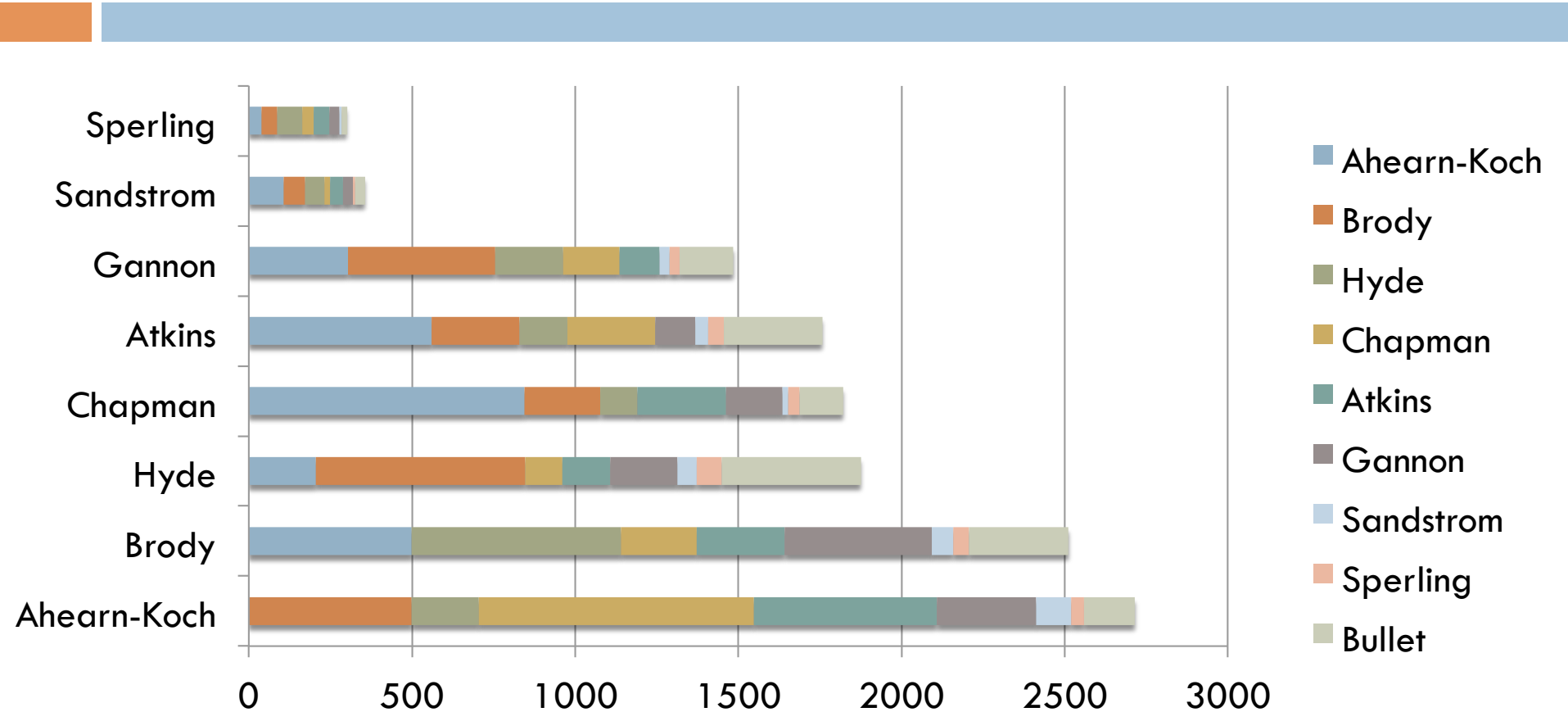

Bullet Voting

Also called single-shot voting, this notes when voters elected not to use their second vote and support only on candidate. Hyde saw the most bullet votes by a significant margin, effectively guaranteeing his spot in the May runoff. Ahearn-Koch had the 5th highest number of bullet votes.

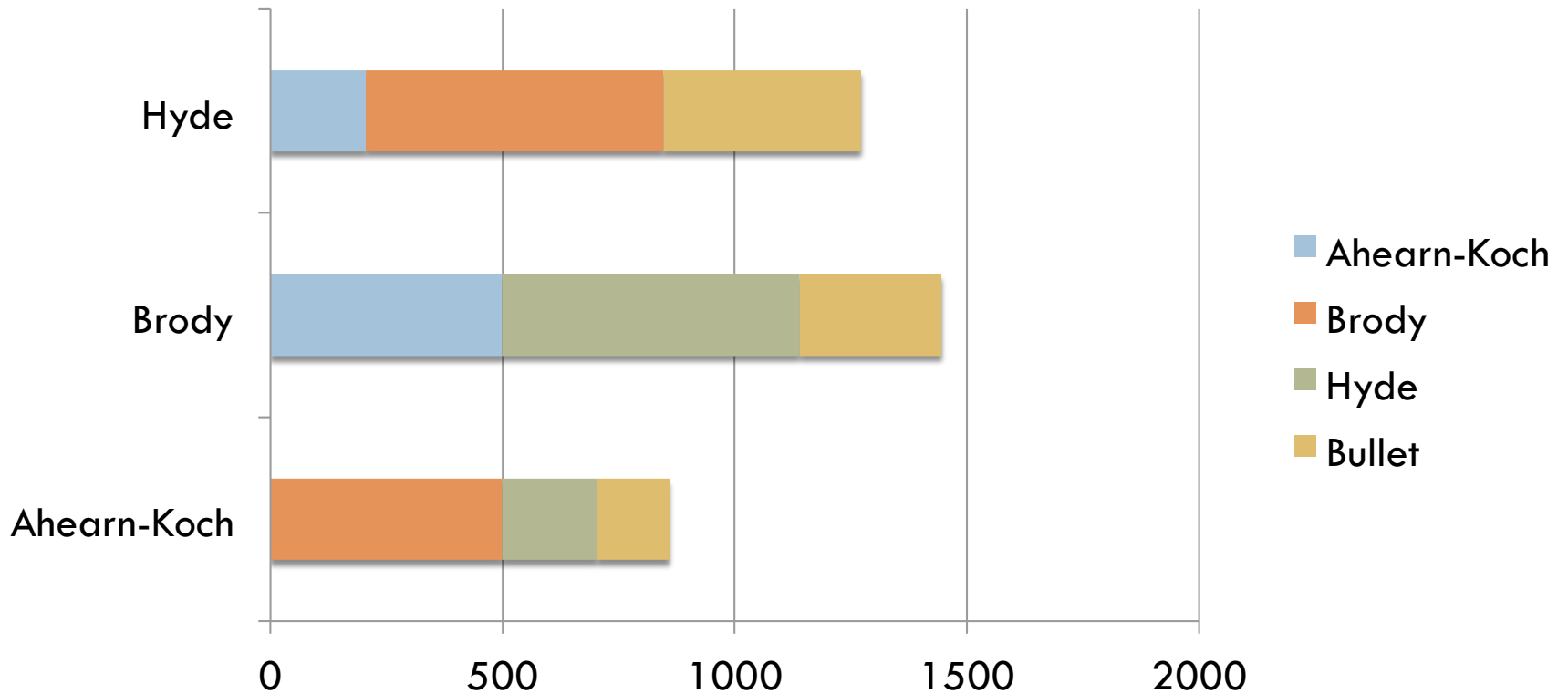


Second Choices



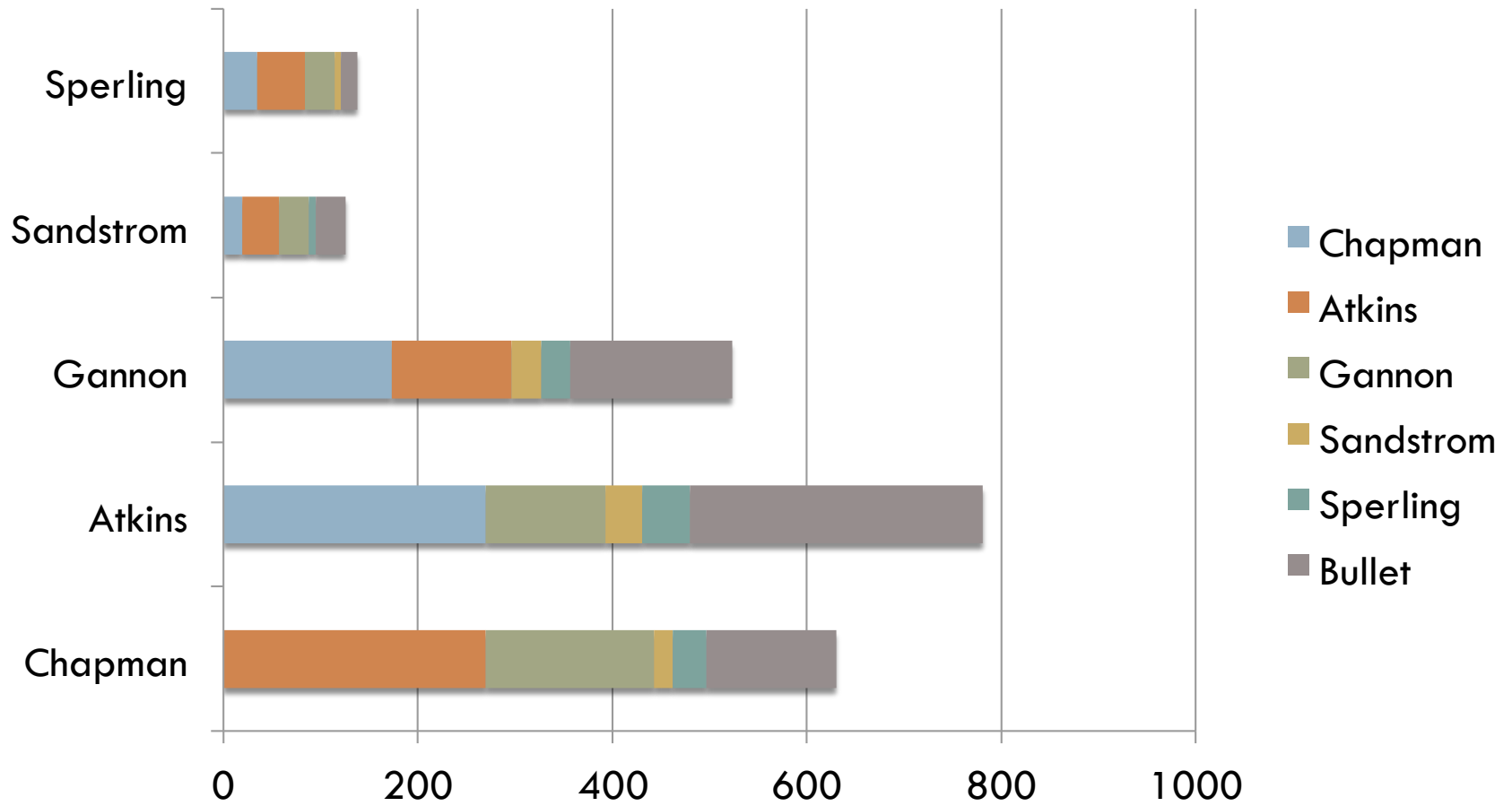
Ahearn-Koch's greatest weakness is likely that she drew most of her support from candidates no longer in the running. While Brody and Hyde saw the greatest overlap with one another, the front-runner got to her spot with the help of Chapman and Atkins voters.

Only Lucky Voters



This graph, of course, shows an extreme situation where every vote for an advancing candidate is considered the voters second choice. If every voter who selected a candidate who failed to make the runoff stays home in May, results would be dramatically different.

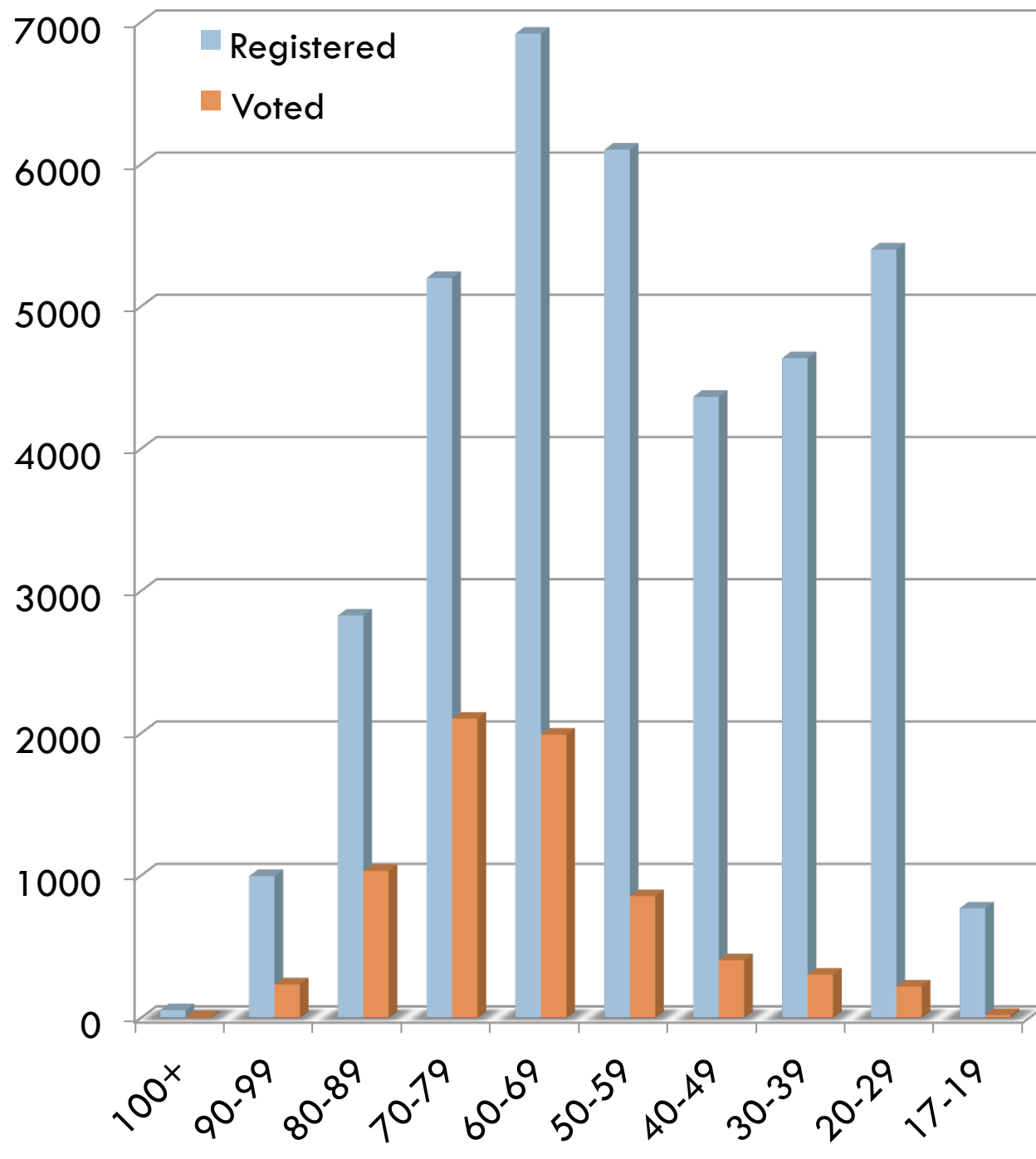
Unlucky Voters



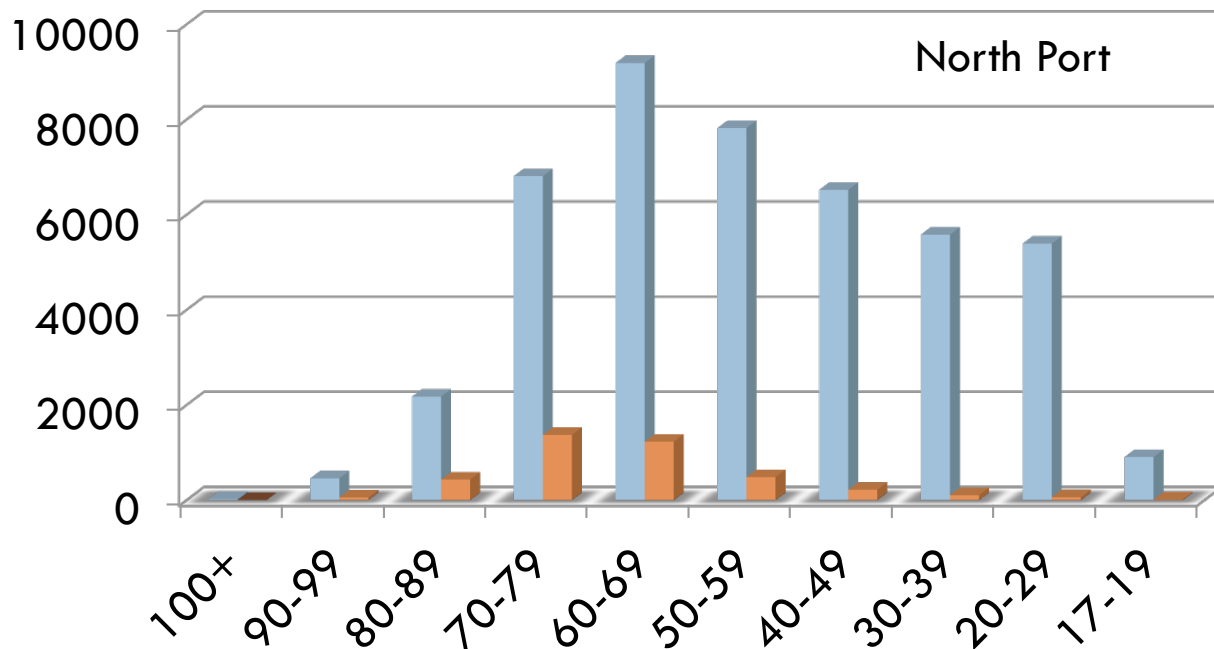
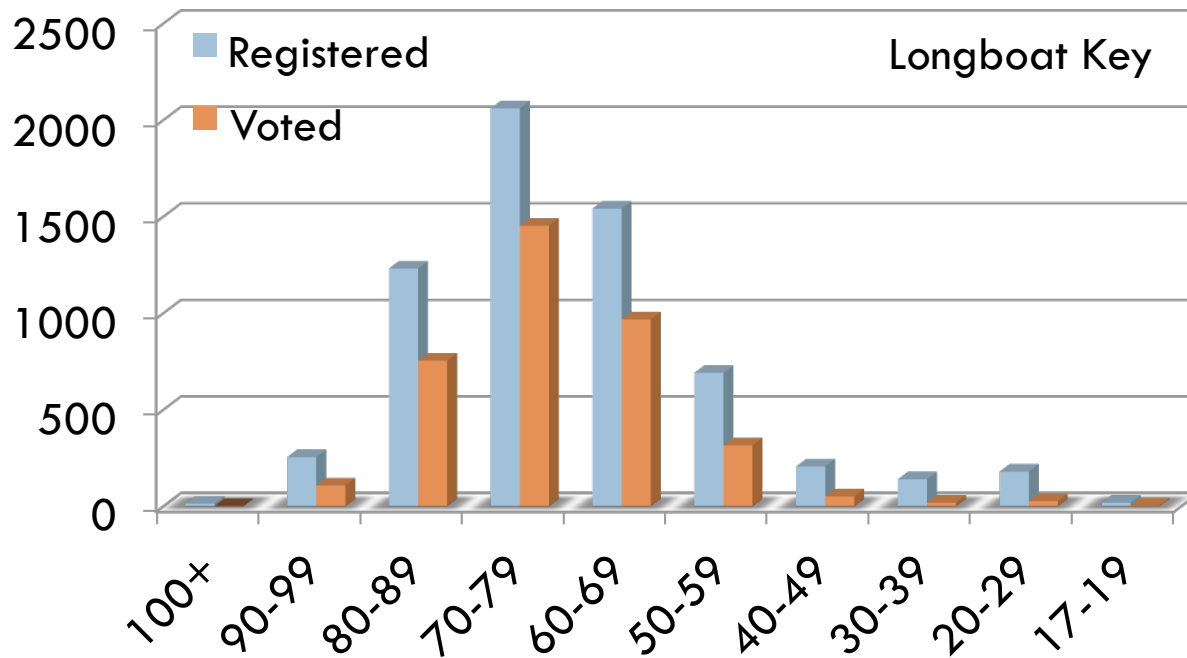
There are 3,621 voters who saw none of their selections advance. These voters may be hard to motivate but also could be fertile ground for the remaining campaigns.

AGE BREAKDOWN

Sarasota's youngest voting demo is growing in numbers but turnout remains abysmally low. Voters in their 60s and 70s continue to dominate the electorate.



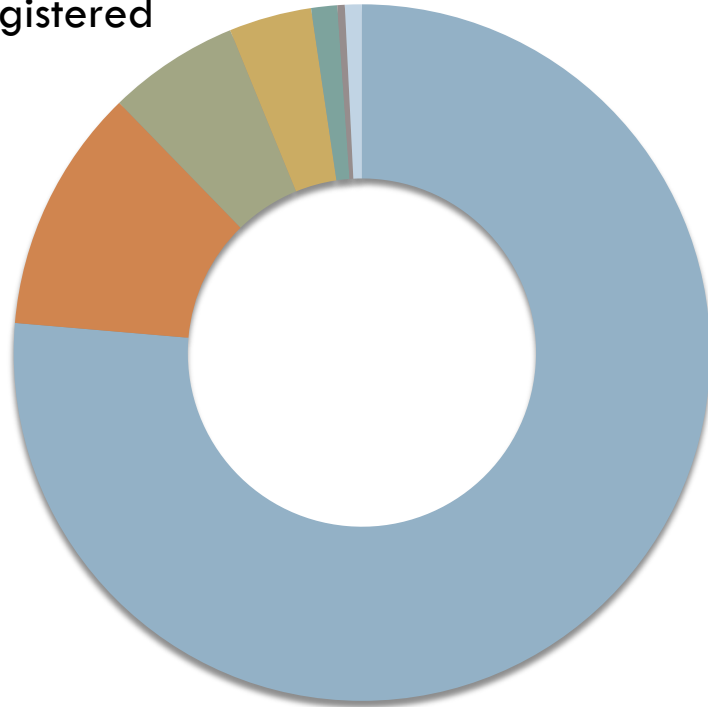
AGE BREAKDOWN



Similarly, turnout remains lowest among the youngest voters in Longboat Key and in North Port, even though the make-up of the cities varies greatly.

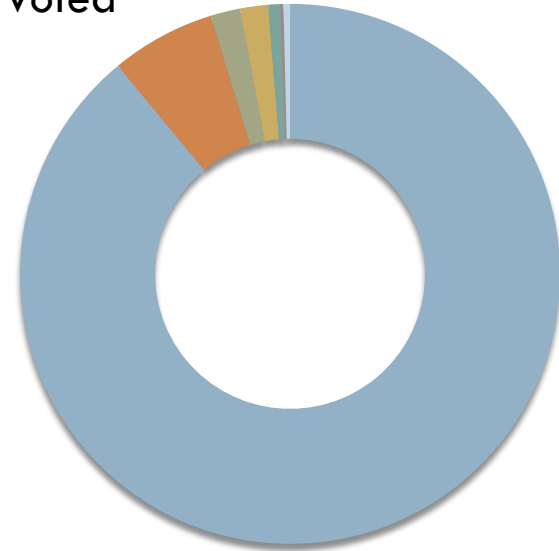
Racial Make-Up

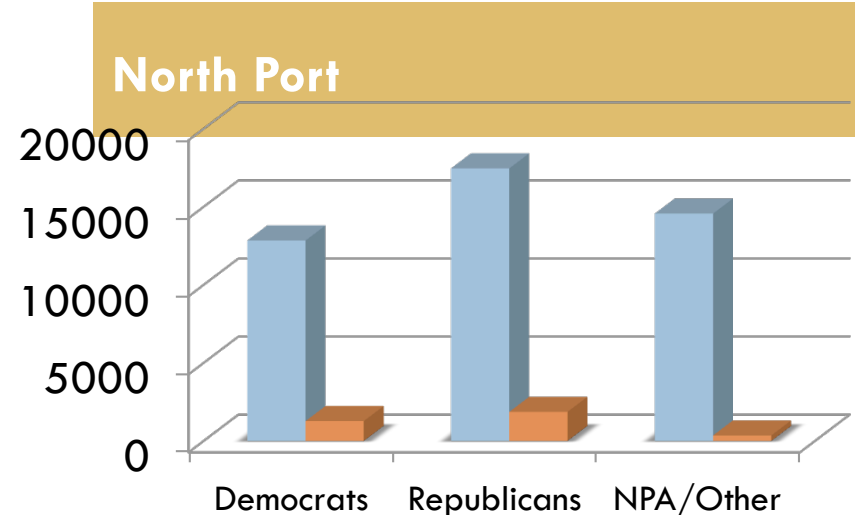
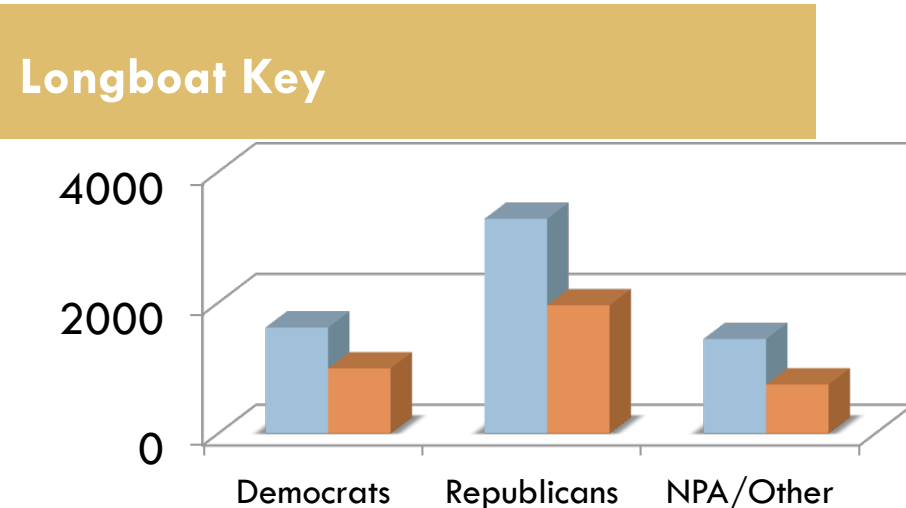
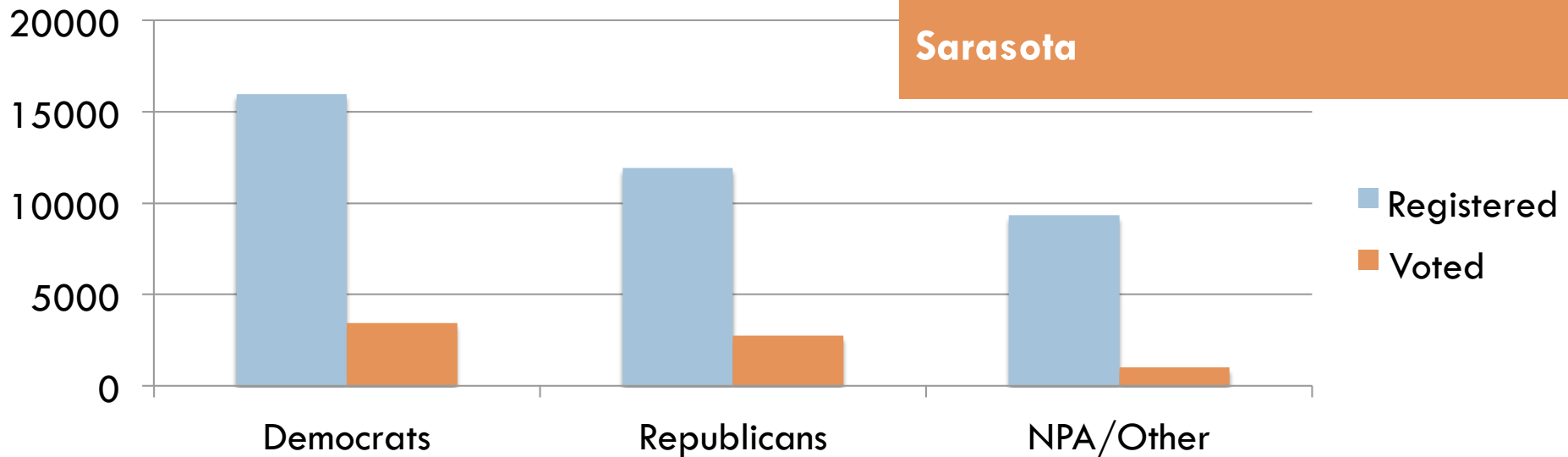
