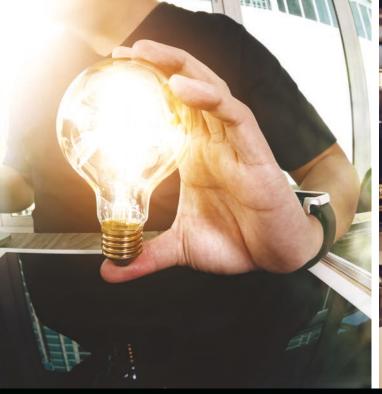

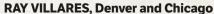

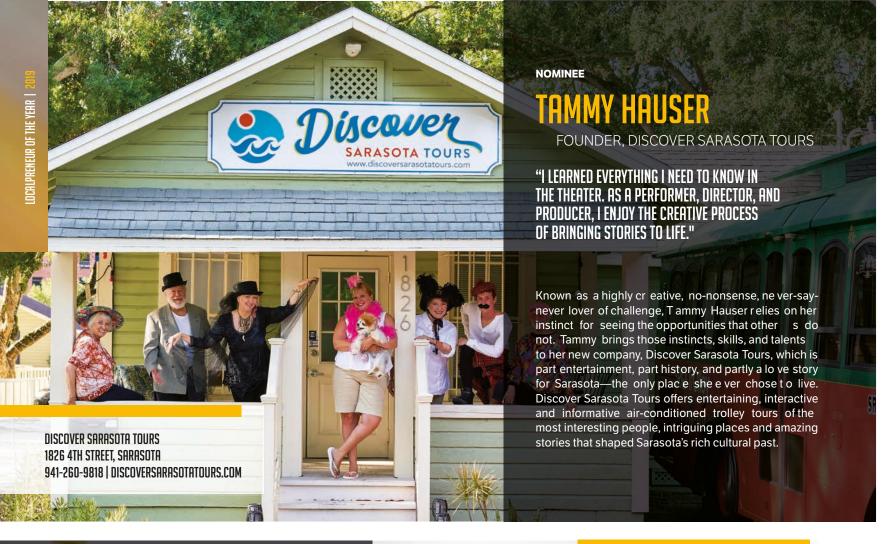

Jakobi started developing Novum in 2017 in the P erlman Price Young Entrepreneurs (PYE) Program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Sarasota County. However, Jakobi's inspiration for the product came at an earlier age when he liv ed in Mumbai and sa w how access to renewable energy sources could signifigantly improve the quality of lif e in de veloping countries. Through PYE, Jakobi conducted market research, built a business plan and pit ched his venture to investors before winning seed funding to create his prototype. He's now selling Novum online through Etsy, and hopes to use a portion of the sales to give back by retrofittin old bikes with No vum and setting them up at public places like parks, schools or hospitals.

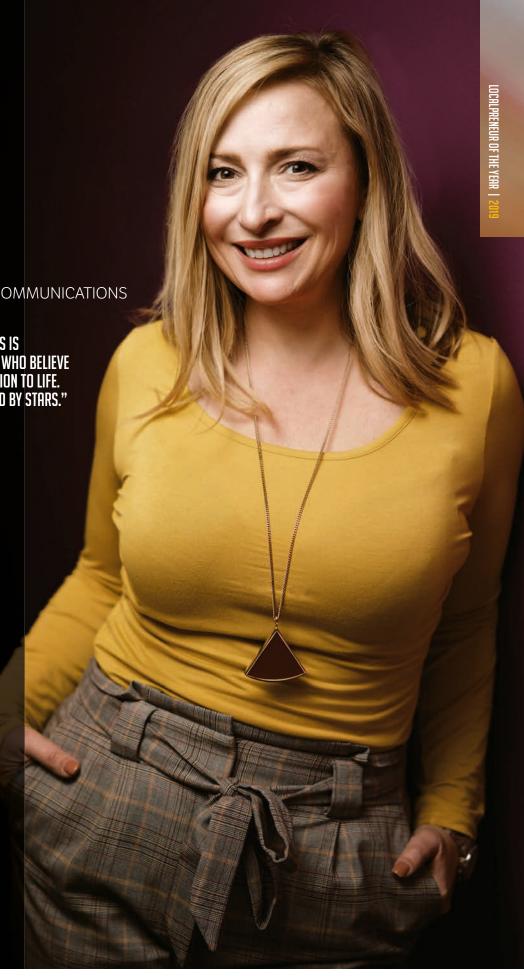
